Beach House opens

THERE'S no longer any need to travel north for coastal-inspired cuisine, as the Beach House Bar and Grill has opened its doors in Westfield's laneway precinct.

The completed project cost \$1.6 million, and was created by prestigious, Sydney-based designer Paul Papadopoulos.

The restaurant is the second franchise of its kind in Queensland, and part-owner Elliot Ingram said it would provide a service for residents that was previously lacking in the area.

"We want to serve the community the best we can and continue to offer value to the people of North Lakes, and surrounding areas," Mr Ingram said.

It took two years for the plan to come together and after the 10-month build time, the grand opening last month was exactly what the three franchisees had hoped for.

Construction of the laneway precinct is now completed, with Ikea expected to open in late 2016.

Baby seat fittings on the move

BUCKLE Up Baby Australia has an interesting business model.

The business fits child restraints safely in vehicles and also rents out baby capsules.

And their motto: Have baby, business will travel.

Every Friday between 10am and 2pm, you will find them under their annex at Baby Bunting North Lakes.

Accredited Fitter Scott Marshall said they charged \$39 for a fitting outside Baby Bunting at North Lakes Drive, North Lakes and \$60 for an in-home fitting.

"People usually buy their seat from Baby Bunting and we fit them," Mr Marshall said.

Buckle Up Baby staff also hire and fit baby capsules.

"Parents might only need capsules for six months so we give them the option of hiring," Mr Marshall said.
